# HOME AND GARDEN REGULATIONS FOR EXHIBITORS

- Entry Forms. Exhibitors must enter online or send/email a completed ENTRY FORM to the Honorary Secretary by <u>Saturday 9 August 2025</u> to qualify for free entry.
- 2. Late entries will be accepted at the Honorary Secretary's discretion on the evening prior to the Show in the Home and Garden Marquee between 4.00pm and 7.00pm and on the morning of the Show up to 8.45am. Late entries will be charged at £0.50 per class.
- 3. The Show admission fee must be paid. Adults £12 Early Bird ticket, £15 Advance Online ticket, £18 on the gate; Under 18s £5 Early Bird ticket, £8 Advance Online ticket or £10 on the gate. Advance Discount tickets can be purchased online at <a href="www.monmouthshow.co.uk/tickets">www.monmouthshow.co.uk/tickets</a>. Readmission passes can be obtained at the gate.
- 4. Every possible care will be taken of exhibits, however the Monmouthshire Show Society Ltd and its Committee, Stewards and volunteers will not be held responsible for any loss or damage that may occur.
- 5. Young Persons Classes. All exhibits in this section must be completed without the help of adults, except in Junior Photography classes. The class number and age must be clearly written on the outside of an envelope with the young person's name and parent/guardian's contact telephone number sealed inside the envelope.
- Novice Classes. For the purposes of this schedule a novice is deemed to be someone who has not won first prize in the class being entered at the Monmouthshire Show.
- 7. **Ownership**. All exhibits must be the exhibitor's own work and not exhibited at the Monmouthshire Show previously.
- 8. **Identification of Exhibits**. All exhibitors in the Home and Garden Section are requested to put their names in a sealed envelope with the Class number on the outside and secure it to the exhibit or the table. Unidentified exhibits will not be judged. Items may be numbered when

- being staged by the stewards to assist judging. If so, numbers are not to be removed by competitors.
- 9. **Staging**. The tent will be open for staging from 4.00pm-7.00pm on the day before the Show and until 8.45am on Show Day. Please report to the Secretary or a steward before staging exhibits.
- 10. Judging. The tent will be closed for judging at 8.45am. The decision of the judges will be final. They shall have the power to withhold prizes when they decide that prizes are not merited. All matters not met by these regulations shall be decided by the Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 11. Judging of craft, home baking and floral items: Craft and cookery items to be judged in line with the WI Show Guide, "On with the Show". In general, only ONE ITEM will be judged from a group, unless specified otherwise in the schedule. Floral items to be judged in accordance with NAFAS show rules. For preserves note that jars must be at least 8oz. Lids may be a wax disc and cellophane lid in a jar without screw neck OR in a twist top jar with a plain lid without wax disc OR pliable press on plastic top with no wax disc on a traditional jar without a screw neck. There should be no names (including location) or trademarks on lids and jars.
- 12. **Judges and Stewards**. Judges and Stewards are not permitted to compete in sections in which they are judging or stewarding.
- 13. If there are less than four entries in any class, the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> prize monies may be withheld at the discretion of the Judges.
- 14. **Prize Money** will be available from the Home and Garden Secretary between 4.30pm and 5.00pm on show day. Prize money not collected between those times will be forfeited.
- 15. **Presentation of Prizes.** Cups will be presented at the Home and Garden Marquee at 4.00pm.
- 16. **Removal of Exhibits**. Exhibits must be left on display until 4.30pm. The tent will be unattended after 6.30pm. No vehicle movement is allowed on site until 6pm.
- 17. **Challenge Cups**. For the purposes of determining the winners, the points awarded will be:

Home and Garden:  $1^{st} - 5$  points  $2^{nd} - 2$  points  $3^{rd} - 1$  point A cup will be awarded from the most points overall.

#### THEMED DISPLAY - Shades of One Colour

Class 1: To be the work of 2 or more people.

Any theme but all items should be in shades in a single colour (green allowed in floral arrangement). Theme to be named in the exhibit and to include the following:

- 2 Cooked Items (1 savoury, 1 sweet, can include preserves)
- 2 Craft Items
- 1 Floral Arrangement

To be viewed and judged from the front.

#### RULFS

- A. Maximum space allowed 80cm width x 80cm depth (31.5" x 31.5").
- B. Up to 20 points will be awarded for each item plus 20 points for staging and interpretation.
- C. Maximum Points 100.

A cup will be awarded to the winner.

#### **FLORAL ART**

#### Please note

Exhibits may contain accessories i.e. non-plant material items, but 'arrangements' may not. All entries may include bases, drapes, title cards, when appropriate. In all entries plant material should dominate. Plant materials include all parts of any kind of plant e.g. flowers and foliage (fresh or preserved), plus fruits, wood, moss, etc. and may be home-grown, purchased or found. Artificial plant materials are not permitted.

STAGING – All entries will be staged on tabling, 80cms (31.5") from floor, with white covering. Staging and take down as per Rules above. Exhibitors may not enter more than one item in any class. Work may be brought fully or partly assembled but all must be the exhibitor's own work. An envelope with name and contact details must be placed with each entry.

- "Mardi Gras" a front-facing exhibit. Space allowed 51cm (20") wide, height optional.
   "Summer Door Wreath" with hanger, judged from the front, max width 40cm.
   "Tiny Treasures" a petite exhibit, not exceeding 25x25x25cms (10"x10"x10"), staged on white cloth.
  - **5** "A Gift for You" an all around arrangement of flowers and foliage, no floral foam, in any container. Space allowed 43cm (15") wide.
  - **"Rain Forest"** an arrangement in any container, any height but must fit into a space of 60cm (16") square (width and depth).

Exhibitors in this section are allowed to enter more than one entry per class but may only win up to two prizes in the class. Craft and cookery items to be judged in line with the WI Show Guide, "On with the Show".
